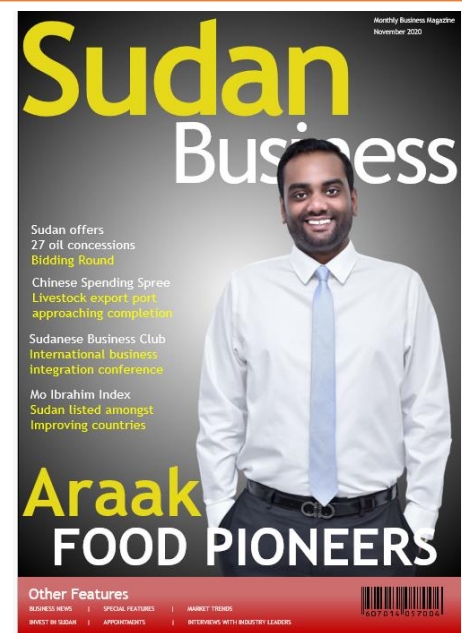

# Governance



The Mo Ibrahim Index stated that the overall progress in Africa has been slowing since 2015, according to the Foundation, although 61.2% of Africa's population live in a country where overall governance is better than in 2010. Still, only eight countries managed to improve in all four categories over the decade – Angola, Chad, Côte d'Ivoire, Ethiopia, Madagascar, Seychelles, Sudan and Togo.

# Oil Production



Sudan announced the start of oil production in Block 25 in the Rawat field in its first stage, with a daily capacity of 440 barrels, which represents the first well of the field, which includes 7 wells, and is expected to achieve daily production of more than 3 thousand barrels per day, after the entry of all these Wells.

# Egypt Relations



Egypt has identified a number of sectors for export to Sudan, whose imports amount to 9 billion dollars, represented in the processed food industries, building materials and chemicals. . Egypt's current efforts contribute to improving relations, including the recent visit of the Prime Minister to Sudan, which resulted in the establishment of 10 bakeries in Sudan, and Egyptian authorities shall organize four commercial promotional missions for the Sudanese market to maintain the strong relations between the two countries, in addition to participating in the Khartoum International Fair, which will be held in January 2021.

# Shipping Camels to China Is Goal of Sudan's \$140 Million Port

A Chinese-built port for shipping livestock from Sudan's Red Sea coast will be completed by year-end, the latest African component of Beijing's Belt and Road Initiative, a Sudanese company official said.

Constructed by China Harbour Engineering Co. and located in Haidob, 60 kilometers (37 miles) south of Port Sudan, the facility is being primed to help transport cattle, camels and sheep for mainly Asian markets, according to the state-run Sea Ports Corp.'s general director, Onour Mohamed Adam.

Livestock exports are a potential growth area for economically ravaged Sudan, which has invested a total of 120 million euros (\$142 million) in the port, Adam said in an interview.

China Harbour, which worked for three years on the project before suspending in 2017, has since renewed its agreement with Sudan's transitional government. Sea Ports will operate the facility, Adam said.

Haidob would be another link in China's modern-day adaptation of the Silk Road, which aims to revive and extend its routes to Europe and Africa with upgraded or new railways, ports, pipelines, power grids and highways. At least 157 nations and international organizations have signed up, with Morgan Stanley estimating spending will total \$1.3 trillion by 2027.

Adam said the financing for the port came from the Finance Ministry's domestic revenue and didn't mention any overseas funds.

Sudan, has also earmarked \$300 million for a 10-year plan to develop Port Sudan's facilities, Adam said. Sudan's state-run Military Industry Corp. will perform the work.

The port shall also be used for shipping goats and sheep.

# Sudan To Offer 27 Oil Concessions In Global Bidding Round

The government of Sudan plans to offer to investors concessions of 27 oil blocks in the country via a global bid, Acting Energy Minister Kheiri Abdelrahman told a local television channel in November.

Sudan aims to attract investors with access to modern technologies for the blocks on offer, of which three are offshore, and 24 are onshore blocks, Radio Dabanga news outlet reported.

Sudan's oil production took a hit in 2011 when South Sudan broke from Sudan and took with it around 350,000 bpd in oil production.

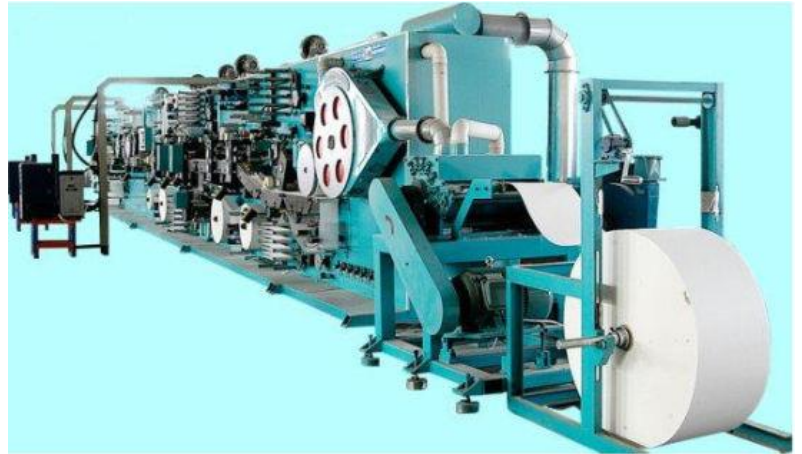
After South Sudan's secession from Sudan, the two countries have been mutually dependent on oil revenues because the south has 75 percent of the oil reserves, while the north has the only current transport route for the oil to international markets.

The secession of South Sudan led to a sharp decline in Sudan's oil exports and fiscal revenues, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) said in its latest report on Sudan last month. With South Sudan's secession, Sudan lost about 75 percent of oil production, 66 percent of exports, and half of fiscal revenues, the IMF noted.

Going forward, the fund assumes that by 2040 oil will be increasingly less important for the Sudan economy, which was producing 72,000 barrels per day (bpd) in 2019. Aging oil fields, along with moderate exploration, are set to keep oil production flat over the medium term. The price of Sudan's crude oil is projected to average \$42 a barrel in the medium term, the IMF said in October.

Meanwhile, Sudan and South Sudan have recently signed a draft agreement under which Sudan will help South Sudan to restart production from Block 5A and will provide technical assistance on blocks 03 and 07, all of them located on the border between the two states. million people out of poverty by 2025, by harnessing high-impact, proven technologies to raise productivity, mitigate risks, and promote diversification and processing.

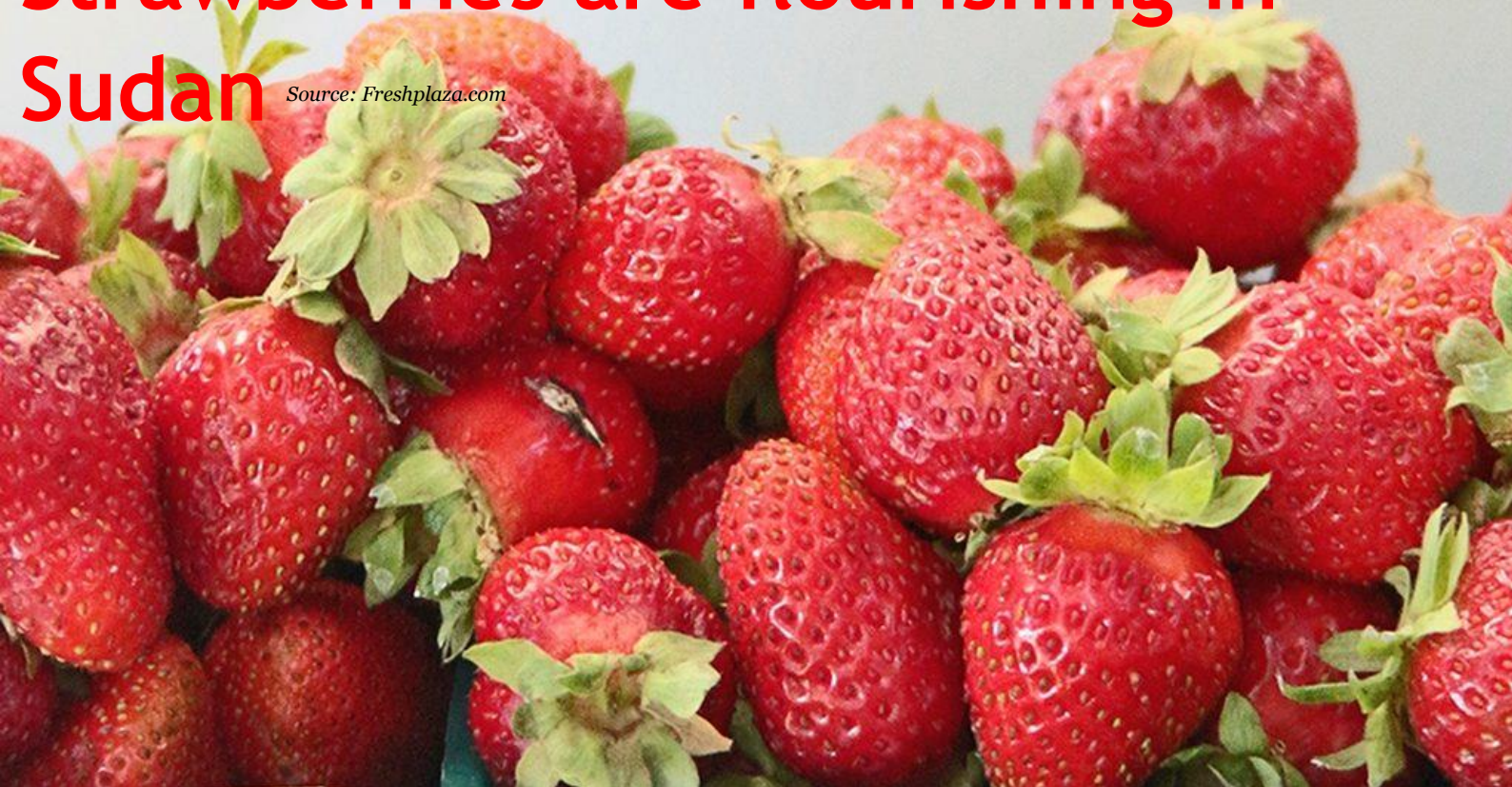
Engineer, Ibnauf said in press statements that the visit of the US company delegation to Sudan is considered practical proof for the revocation of Sudan's name from the list of the

# Strawberries are flourishing in Sudan

Strawberry are being found to flourish in many parts of Sudan, a matter that can open avenues for its export to provide greatly need foreign cash.

In some farms, an acre of strawberries has produced between 10-15 tons of strawberry fruits.

Although strawberry cultivation is a relatively new practice in Sudan, nevertheless, it was found to adapt to the country's hot weather.

There were some other individual experiments that succeeded in growing and exporting strawberries One of these was made by Ms. Renad Hisham Abukshwa, a dental medicine student at the Almada'en University. "I have loved farming as a young girl, having been born in a farming family," she told Sudanow.

She said she has faith in farming and is convinced that agricultural production is Sudan's only way out of its economic problems. "There is no need for us to import frozen strawberries instead of growing them here. As you can see, I have a successful farming project here.

Strawberries can be grown in all types of soil, but they flourish better in sandy soil, preferably with no salinity. The soil should also have good drainage and should be free from weeds. There are different strawberry varieties. But the best that can flourish in Sudan is the heat-resistant variety known as 'Festival California'. This variety is special in that its fruits are big, very sweet and suitable for exportation.

We interview ***Hassan Abdelhalim, Business Development Manager at Araak***, to learn more about the history of the organization and their drive to succeed to become one of Sudan's leading conglomerate.

Finally, and more recently we ventured into the food franchise businesses of KFC & Pizza Hut and distributorships of KraftHeinz, Lays and Friesland Campina.

# Dilemma in times of crisis

In times of crisis, many companies are faced with a very difficult reality of poor production or sales, and thus the company's inability to fulfil the many financial obligations that it was making in the days of prosperity.

Examples of crises are many, such as the corona crisis, the collapse of global oil prices and their impact on global demand, or the global financial crisis in 2008 or the one looming on the horizon now.

Employees are directly affected in such times, because companies are then faced with difficult choices to save the company.

One of those options might be sending a percentage of employees on leave without pay, as Schlumberger did with engineers specializing in oil exploration during the price collapse, which is a difficult option, but it is better than dismissal.

Or reducing the number of employees by cutting them off with all rights, as the global company Samsung did years ago as a result also of the slowdown in global demand.

There may be a neutral option, such as reducing salaries, reducing working hours or days, or some companies may require their employees to apply for leave without pay voluntarily and for a period that is alternating between all employees.

The companies must make an effort to reflect the employees' financial position in full transparency and frankness while communicating the idea that the procedures that are taken are for the purpose of preserving the employees until the crisis is over and life returns to normal, and whoever succeeds in that will gain the employees' cooperation and this will be the greatest aid to overcoming the critical pit.

# Sudan signs MOU for construction of 500 MW of solar power firms

The government of Sudan has signed with the United Arab Emirates particularly the Abu Dhabi Fund for Development, a memorandum of understanding for the construction of solar power firms with a total capacity of 500 MW. The MoU was signed on Sunday the 1st of November 2020 by the Sudanese minister of energy and mining, Khairy Abdul Rahmanhas, and the general director of the Abu Dhabi Fund for Development, Mohamed Saif Al Suwaidi.

The Sudanese government, in an official statement, pledged to buy back the energy produced by these plants at a competitive price for a period of 20 years. The plants whose number and size are yet to be disclosed will be built by unknown UAE energy companies.

If implemented, these projects would represent the East African country's first attempt to set up utility-scale PV capacity. The country has one of the lowest levels of solar development in the region although it has one of the highest levels of solar radiation in the world, exceeding 2000 kWh/m<sup>2</sup> per annum.

Hydropower still dominates the country's power supply sector with a 70% share, while solar energy is at the bottom of the list providing less than 0.1% share despite the government's efforts to increase the share of renewables in the country's energy mix over the past years.

According to the latest statistics from the International Renewable Energy Agency, Sudan had only 19 MW of installed solar power at the end of last year. The East African country government is aiming to install 500 MW of solar and 300 MW of wind by the end of the current year.

Dr. Adel Farah Idris, Minister of Livestock and Fisheries, confirmed the flow of livestock exports and slaughtered meat to international markets in accordance with international standards and controls. He pointed out that the ship Victoria had arrived at the Qatari ports with 22,900 of sheep and 500 calves, indicating that this shipment was in the interest of the Qatari Widam Food Company, Sudan branch, indicating that the ships of export would follow to the Gulf countries. He stressed the Ministry's endeavour to open new markets for exports of live and slaughtered livestock.

# Sudanese Achievers

## Zarouhi Sarkissian

### Sudan's first female doctor

Dr Zarouhi Sarkissian was born in Bahri, Sudan in the year 1929. Her Armenian father Vahan Sarkissian married Attiat Mohamed Najm of Egyptian descent

Her father sadly passed away in 1930 leaving behind his widowed wife and two daughters Taqwi Sarkissian and Zarouhi Sarkissian and his step daughter named Rifqa (also known as Zainub Mustafa Bayoumi). Dr Zarouhi Sarkissian graduated from Unity High School and entered Kitchener School of Medicine (now known as the University of Khartoum) in the year 1946.

At the time she was the youngest student to be enrolled into this school at the age of 17 which was uncommon as most students would enroll to university between the ages of 18-20. She graduated from Kitchener School of Medicine in the year 1952 making history as the first Sudanese and youngest female doctor to graduate among eight other male doctors and alongside her colleague Dr Khalda Zahir who was three years older. Dr Zarouhi Sarkissian and Dr Khalda Zahir were both seen as pioneers in their field particularly given the challenges at the time around female empowerment and male dominance in society.



She went on after graduation to work in Wad Madani and operated her own private clinic. During this period she established herself and through her dedication to her patients and strong work ethic she inspired many other women to follow in her footsteps and pursue medicine as a career.

She was featured in the famous Egyptian magazine Al Masawar in an article about her career as the first female Sudanese doctor in the issue of 9/9/1955.



She wanted to pursue obstetrics and gynaecology, however, in 1955 she married Saad Mustafa Aboulela and dedicated her life thereafter to raising her three children Leila, Nader and Nada Saad Aboulela. Although she left the medical field she maintained her strong relationships and ties with her colleagues in the medical field e.g Dr Ahmed Abdelaziz Yacoub, Dr Sayda Dirdirri, Dr Taha Talat, Dr Fouad Abdo Idris, Dr Salah Abdelrahman, Dr Ali Taha, Dr Widad Kronfli, Dr Abdelsalam Saleh, Dr Abdelhalim Mohamed Halim and many more. This is a true testament to her continued passion for the field throughout her life.

Dr Zarouhi Sarkissian converted to Islam in 1960 and was renamed Thuraya Mohamed Saad. She was infamous for her generosity, friendliness, hospitality, culinary skills and infectious sense of humour. She performed a lot of charitable deeds and was humble towards everyone. This was largely driven by the fact that she'd come from a modest family.

Dr Zarouhi Sarkissian passed away in London on 1st December 1986 at St Mary's Hospital and was buried in Brookwood Cemetery in London.
